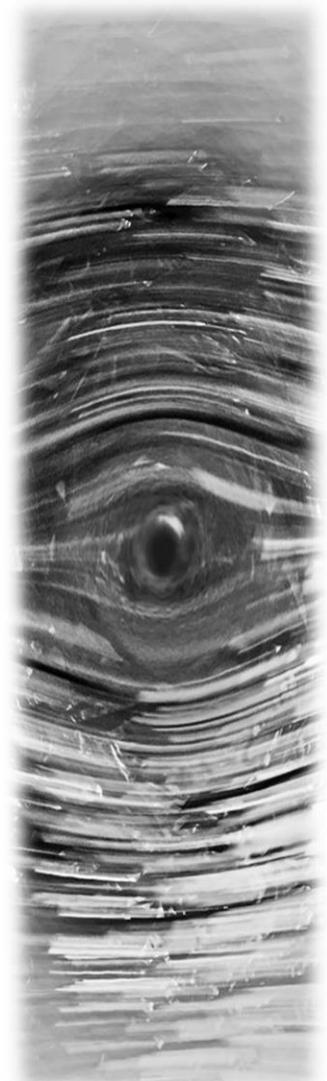

Appearance of spots or floaters causing blurring of normal vision. Causes mainly include the following:

- Damage to normal blood vessels
- Growth of abnormal blood vessels
- Bleeding from various parts of the eye



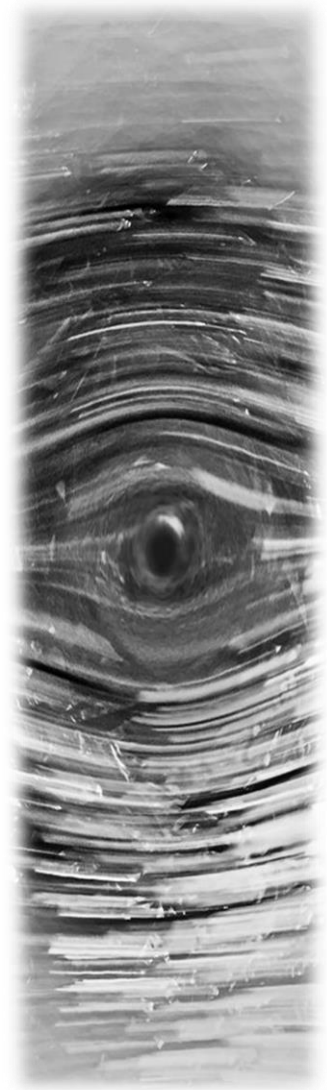
Why is it?

Retinitis Pigmentosa

A group of eye diseases leading to damage of photoreceptor cells of the retina.

It is an inherent disorder caused by gene mutations sending faulty messages to the retinal cells.

Retinaid

Retinaid is a software based visual assistant for people suffering from Vitreous Haemorrhage or Retinitis Pigmentosa.

Mainly developed as an Android application, Retinaid helps these people to carry out their everyday tasks in a smooth manner. It provides the following options:

Retinaid Magnifier for Android • Retinaid Scan and View • Retinaid Camera • Retinaid Navigation • Retinaid Audio Assistance
